It is August, already! The summer is flying by. I hope you have been able to take some time off or made plans to relax during this summer season. The weather has been stifling, the rain has all but stopped (I am writing this 7/13) but there is good news; I haven't had to cut the grass for the last two weeks! More good news is that despite the dry weather our city wells remain in good shape. Recovery is normal, but if the dry weather continues, we may need to look at water restrictions. Do your part in the meantime, by conserving water whenever you can. Water your lawns & gardens prudently, in the evening, this prevents evaporation. Consider taking your car to the car wash, most of the water used at car washes is recycled. Consider adjusting the air conditioning "up" when you are away from home. The hot weather can be dangerous for many segments of our society. Be aware the Carroll County Senior Center (located on Roberts Mill Rd) has been designated as a "heat relief site".

STREET SWEEPING

On Monday, August 16, 2010, the following will be swept: East and West Baltimore Street, Frederick Street, York Street, Trevanion Road, Trevanion Terrace, Kings Drive, Kings Court, Courier Drive, and Courier Court. Vehicles should not be parked on these streets until after they have been swept. Sweeping occurs between the hours of 7 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Should inclement weather prevail, sweeping will take place on the following Monday.

On Monday, September 20, 2010, the following will be swept: East and West Baltimore Street, Frederick Street, York Street, Huntinghorn Street, Huntinghorn Court, Kenan Street (Copperfield), Bentley Street, Bison Street, and Morning Frost Street. Streetscape construction areas will not be swept. Vehicles should not be parked on these streets until after they have been swept. Sweeping occurs between the hours of 7 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Should inclement weather prevail, sweeping will take place on the following Monday.

No age restrictions, so if you are feeling overwhelmed by the heat, stop by and cool off!

Also heating up are the political races for this fall. The candidates are out pounding the pavement and will be knocking on your doors. This year's elections will be the first time in Carroll County we elect our County Commissioners by district. Taneytown lies in District 1, which encompasses the northern tier of the county, from Keymar and Taneytown in the west to Manchester and Lineboro in the east. It has been a long time since we have had direct representation in Westminster from our area, so do your homework and make your vote count.

It has been a busy summer for the City. You will recall Council elected to replace the City Manager in April. I have been serving in this capacity during the time we were searching for a replacement. I must say, filling this role gives one a new perspective of all the complexities of running a city (even a city of 7200 people). On July 9th, our new City Manager began work. After the evalua-

tion of many resumes of qualified candidates, Council selected long time Taneytown resident, city councilman, former Mayor Pro Tem and Mayor, Henry Heine for the position. I know many of you know Henry. He has been involved with the city, serving in many other volunteer capacities for all the years he has lived here. Henry retired from Maryland Transportation Authority (and from City Council), to accept this position. He was a project manager and su-

WATER CONSERVATION REMINDER

Although City well water levels are adequate at this time, they can deplete quickly under drought conditions like we're currently experiencing. Please be thoughtful about your use of water when washing vehicles and watering lawns. It is normal for grass to become dormant and brown in hot, dry weather. A healthy lawn of perennial grass, though completely brown, can survive months with no water and will recover quickly once rain returns.

CARROLL COUNTY SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING PROGRAM ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

All of the following materials can be placed in your recycle bin:

Plastic

Wide-mouth containers such as empty peanut butter, margarine/butter tubs, yogurt, cottage cheese, sour cream, mayonnaise, whipped topping, and prescription medicine bottles (note that the lids and caps do not need removed).

Narrow-neck empty plastic containers with plastic resin identification code 1 through 7 (no motor oil or transmission fluid bottles, please!)

Metal

Any empty metal food and beverage containers, including aluminum or other metals

Aluminum foil and aluminum pie pans

Aerosol Cans, empty only

Glass

Glass containers such as empty jars and bottles, all colors accepted

Paper

Juice and broth boxes

Milk and juice containers, including gable top cartons

Cardboard and paperboard boxes (including cereal boxes without liners)

Office paper (including typing, fax, copy, letterhead, NCR) and

Envelopes

Newspapers (including all inserts)

Magazines and catalogs

Junk mail

Books (including paperbacks, textbooks, and hardbacks)

Brown paper bags (Kraft paper)

Corrugated boxes

Telephone books

Non-metallic wrapping paper

Computer printouts

No Styrofoam, please!

pervisor with MTA. Henry brings all the tools necessary to "hit the ground running". I think this is a great move for the City and with Henry's knowledge and experience we will be able to move forward a level not before realized. When you get a chance stop by and welcome Henry to his new position or drop him an e-mail or card, I'm sure he will appreciate the encouragement.

In other Mayor and Council news, several of us have recently returned from the Maryland Municipal League's annual convention. This year, as in past years, the information gained, the one on one contact we made with top state officials, the exposure to suppliers and service vendors and the networking between other cities and towns has and will pay huge dividends to the city. I know I attended several "work sessions" that gave me great insights into the problems and opportunities we face as part of municipal Maryland. The topic high on the list of most attendees was what we can do to stop the state from further depleting our needed revenues and to restore those revenues already cut. The respect and strength that cities and towns enjoy through their association with the Maryland Municipal League should not be underestimated. We are making plans now for the 2011 legislative session. Again it's important that when the politicians "come calling" that you ask them the question "what do you plan to do to help Maryland's cities & towns?"

I hope some of you have had a chance to visit Memorial Park recently. You'll remember that we had to replace the old "merry go round" much to the disappointment of many. The "new merry go round" has been installed as promised,

so take the kids down to the park for a twirl! Also the Council awarded a bid for a new playground to be located on the old swimming pool site in Memorial Park. The playground is going to be "something else" so make sure you check it out. Installation should begin soon and it should be ready to go by month's end.

Streetscape is moving forward at the expected pace (believe it or not) and by the time you read these remarks most of the work to be done on East and West Baltimore Street will be winding down for a while. The construction will be shifting to the downtown area. While you may find it easier to travel around town, the downtown will present challenges. This is going to pose a particular problem to businesses. I have made a commitment to the business owners that there will be little or no interruption to their ability to do business. I ask for your help that during this time you make every effort to support the downtown businesses. We have three municipal parking lots within easy walking distance to all downtown businesses. They will appreciate your support. Speaking of downtown one of the most useful sessions I attended during the MML conference was one on downtown economic development. The many ideas gleaned from this session can be put to work right away. Additionally, the City's Economic Development Committee has been meeting with experts on marketing "historic downtowns" and is making much progress. When our "streetscape" project is complete, our downtown will be a "magnet" for small businesses and shops and the committee is planning now, to have those businesses in place. You know it has been said that "Opportunity Knock's but Once". If you have ever thought that you would like to

Grill Safety Tips

Gas grills
 Propane is highly flammable, but can be used safely if proper measures are taken.

- Carefully read all instructions and warnings prior to use.
- Check grill hoses for cracking, brittleness, holes and leaks. Make sure that no sharp bends exist in the hose or tubing.
- Move gas hoses away from hot surfaces and dripping grease.
- Always keep propane cylinders upright.
- Never store a spare propane cylinder under or near the grill, or indoors.
- Never store or use flammable liquids near the grill.
- Do not use a gas grill indoors or in an enclosed environment. Never bring the propane cylinder into the house.
- When you fill or exchange your cylinder, have your supplier check for dents, damage, rust or leaks on the cylinder you will be transporting home.

Charcoal grills
 Charcoal produces carbon monoxide (CO), a colorless, odorless gas, when it is burned. CO can accumulate in closed environments and reach toxic levels.

- Carefully read all instructions and warnings prior to use.
- Charcoal should never be used indoors. Never burn charcoal inside of homes, vehicles, tents, garages or campers. Every year about 17 people die as a result of CO fumes generated by charcoal being burned inside.
- Do not store charcoal grills indoors with freshly used coals. Charcoal produces CO fumes until it is completely extinguished.
- Only use starter fluid formulated for the purpose. Never use gasoline to start a charcoal fire.



Girl Scouts at Mother Seton School live out their Girl Scout promise in various local ways. 





WILMA WITHEROW WOOD PECHACEK HOMEMAKER, VOLUNTEER

Wilma Witherow Wood Pechacek, 94, a 90-year resident of Cleveland Park in Northwest Washington, DC, with strong family ties to the Taneytown, MD area, died at her home in Washington on May 10, 2010 of natural causes.

The daughter of Charles Washington and Noro Mary Angell Witherow and granddaughter of William Walker and Amelia Staub Witherow, Wilma was born July 11, 1915 in Girard, Pennsylvania. She and her parents moved to Washington, DC's Georgetown in 1918 and to Cleveland Park in 1920.

She attended John Eaton School, Western High School and Strayer College in Washington. 




