WATER/SEWER BILLS

Water/Sewer bills were issued July 1st with a due date of July 31st. Any bill that has not been paid by the 31st will be assessed a 10% late penalty fee and will be due by August 17th by 3:00 PM. Water shut-off is scheduled after August 18th, 2016. If water service is interrupted for non-payment, there will be an additional restoration fee of \$50 to reconnect water service. Questions regarding your bill can be directed to the Water/Sewer Department at 410-751-1100.

- Stop by in person at the City Office, at 17 E. Baltimore Street, open Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
- Drop your payment in our drop box located on the front of our building on the right
- Mail your payment to our office, 17 E. Baltimore St.
- Pay online at www.taneytown.org (there is a \$6.95 convenience for every \$250)

MONTHLY PRE-PAYMENT PLAN

Paying monthly on your water/sewer bill account continues to be an option for your household budget. Please be sure your account number is referenced at time of payment. All payments collected prior to the quarterly billing will be reflected on your account with the net balance due. Any over payments will remain on your account as a credit toward your next quarterly bill. If you want an annual average, please call the Water/Sewer Department at 410-751-1100.

WATER AND SEWER RATES INCREASE

Effective with the quarterly billing period beginning July 1, 2016, water and sewer rates will increase. The new rates will be reflected on the bill for the quarter ending September 2016. Please keep in mind, that if final reads are requested after July 1, 2016, the new rates will apply. The new water rate will be \$7.63 per 1,000 gallons and the sewer rate will be at \$14.99 per 1,000 gallons. The rate increase is based on Ordinance No. 24-2016. Questions regarding the increase can be directed to the Water/Sewer Department at 410-751-1100.

DEAR PROPERTY OWNERS:

The City of Taneytown would like to take this opportunity to clarify our policy on estimated water bills. If the City does not get a radio read of your water meter (we do not need to enter your property to get this reading), the system will estimate your bill based on the previous three (3) quarters usage. There will also be a message on the water bill stating METER CHECK DUE NOW CALL ASAP. If you see this message, please contact the City office at 410-751-1100. We will set up an appointment with you to inspect our equipment and replace the battery that is located in your house.

If your bill has this note, please contact the City office at 410-751-1100, immediately, so that we can schedule a time to physically check the meter, obtain an actual read and/or complete needed repair, so we can obtain future radio reads. This process should take approximately 10 - 15 minutes. All you need to do is allow us a clear passage to your water meter in your home.

STREET SWEEPING SCHEDULE:

Vehicles are prohibited from parking in the metered spaces on the posted no-parking streets between the hours of 5:00 A.M. and 10:00 A.M. Vehicles that are not moved during this time period will be issued a parking citation. Residents may park their vehicles in the municipal parking lot on Record Lane or in the rear parking lot of the Police Station. Thank you for your cooperation.

TRASH AND RECYCLING REMINDER:

- Week of Labor Day: Collection will take place on Thursday, September 8, 2016 instead of Wednesday, September 7, 2016.

Please set your trash and recycling out the night before the above sched-

uled collection. Hughes Trash & Recycling will have additional equipment and personnel picking up much earlier than normal.

YARD WASTE REMINDER:

You must call the City Office no later than 3 p.m. Monday to schedule for pick up the next day. Currently there are no charges to Carroll County residents for disposal of yard waste at the County Landfill in Westminster (410) 386-4550.

- Please place your bags at the curb by 7:30 a.m., the morning of pick up.
- Yard waste must be placed in paper kraft bags only.
- Please limit the weight of bags so they can easily be lifted for loading and unloading without bag breakage.
- This service is limited to grass clippings, flower & shrubbery trimmings only. Please do not dispose of dirt, sod, thistle, or household garbage.

GRASS CLIPPINGS:

Please do not sweep or blow grass and debris into the street. This practice can block downstream storm water inlet grates and pipes causing storm water to backup into the street, creating flooding conditions. Also, please report anyone observed dumping materials into the storm water drainage system, by contacting the Taneytown Police Department (410-751-1150) or the City Office (410-751-1100). It could be contaminating our environment.

wells in a more efficient manner. We have had much discussion over the past several months about those water and sewer rates. I truly desire lower water and sewer user fees but to have property owners subsidize people's water and sewer bill with their property tax dollars is, as one councilman proposes, simply not fair. The best way to realize long term lower water & sewer rate is to increase the efficiency of our waste water & drinking water system by adding new users. I am optimistic that the next fiscal year will realize a higher degree of efficiency and enable your council to look at some relief.

We have been busy, as usual around town and at City Hall. Summer began with a "bang" when the best carnival in Carroll County, the Taneytown Fireman's Carnival, opened their gates. Good weather made this event a great success for our Firemen, The Wine Music and Art Event held the last day of the Carnival was a super time and a success; and the good crowd enjoyed a marvelous day. The wine flowed, the bands played. A good time was had by all. We have plenty coming up too. The Lions will be back with their Family Fun Days, and Fall Fest is just around the corner to name just two. The City Council has been busy with legislation to ensure only the highest levels of ethical standards are part of the fabric of our City government. The Council passed (4-1) Code of Conduct resolution that all elected officials are expected to abide by while in office. This omission became evident when we realized that previously we had no way to protect the

City from elected officials that may act inappropriately while in office. Linked to this is a Carter Resolution that was passed two months ago (4-1) allowing Council to remove a Council person from office if guilty of wrong doing. This Charter Resolution was challenged, in the form of a petition for referendum by a few citizens in town, under the premise that only the voters should be able to remove someone from office, guilty of wrongdoing or not. Some people have told me that they thought the referendum had to do with lowering water and sewer rates, but it has nothing to do with this. In order to bring a proposed Charter Resolution to referendum, twenty percent of the City's voters must sign the petition. We have received the petition and are currently verifying the signatures to see if the twenty percent rule has been met. The result should be finalized by the August Council Meeting. If, indeed the threshold is met, then the City will most likely hold a special election (It is still up to the City Council to decide to move forward with the special election, even if the signatures are verified) and ask all citizens to weigh in with their vote.

In other Council news, long time Councilman (9 yrs) Angelo Zambetti has decided to resign his seat. This was effective at the July Council Meeting. This came as a bit of a surprise, just before the Council meeting. Angelo said the reason for his decision was that he is a believer in term limits and he has already served longer than the eight years of two-term Council person. Angelo was appointed to Council originally to fill my seat when I was elected Mayor. Angelo has served the citizens well and I always valued his opinion and insight. The procedure to fill Angelo's

vacant seat is that the Mayor, me, suggests to Council a nominee(s) and the Council approves or rejects this person. In an effort to bring the Council to full strength as soon as possible I considered all the candidates who ran in the last election (May 2015) plus several others who had expressed interest. It is fortunate we have a number of citizens who are interested in serving. My main desire was to keep the Council running at full strength, due to the many issues we have to deal with in the coming months. Also, I considered that because Angelo's seat will be filled with the next election (May 2017), only nine months way, I felt I should nominate someone who could "hit the ground running". While all the candidates I considered were worthy. I felt that one with the most experience would be the correct

12th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION TANEYTOWN HISTORY MUSEUM

The Taneytown History Museum will be celebrating their 12th anniversary on August 12th from 1:00 - 4:00 p.m. This is the first year at our new location of 340 E. Baltimore Street, Taneytown. During the 1920's to 1950's this was the home of Martin Koons who had a Hudson car dealership at this location.

In January 2004 a lease was negotiated with the city to use the building at 24 E. Baltimore Street for the purpose of establishing a history museum. The museum opened August 1st in time for the 250th Taneytown celebration. The museum lost the lease and for awhile was closed. In 2013 TH&MA became the beneficiary through a generous donation of the property at 340 E. Baltimore Street. Immediately meetings began to plan renovations. The museum recently celebrated their Grand Opening on April 30th. Now we have reached another milestone and will be celebrating our 12th anniversary. What began as a very small group of volunteers has now grown to over 60+ volunteers.

Come out and celebrate this important milestone with us and tour the museum. Volunteers will be available to answer questions. Dress up cutouts will be available for photos. Free ice cream and cookies will be available.

HUDSON CAR DAY AT TANEYTOWN HISTORY MUSEUM

The Taneytown Heritage and Museum Association, Inc. will have a Hudson car show day at the History Museum, 340 E. Baltimore Street, Taneytown, MD July 23rd, 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. At 12 Noon the owners of the cars will be available to talk about their cars.

The Hudson Motor Co. made Hudson cars in Detroit, Michigan from 1909 to 1954. Hudson cars sold for less than \$1,000. The first car out of the factory in Detroit was July 3, 1909. Hudson merged in 1954 with Nash and formed AMC. After the 1957 model year the Hudson name was discontinued.

The Hudson Co. had a lot of firsts: dual brakes, dashboard oil pressure and generator warning lights, and the first balanced crankshaft. In 1926 Hudson Co. had a new \$10 million body plant opened where all steel closed bodies were built for the Hudson and Essex models. They had factories in England and Belgium. Hudson was the third largest U.S. car maker in 1929 after Ford Motor Co. and Chevrolet.

There will be several Hudson cars on display along with their owners present to tell about the car. Come out and visit the museum and see these beautiful vintage cars and meet the owners. The museum was once a Hudson dealership. One of the cars was actually sold by Martin Koons, the Hudson dealer in Taneytown from the 1920's to 1950's. The museum will be open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The Hudson cars will be on display from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Free lemonade and cookies will be served.

Additional parking is available at the adjoining Northwest Middle School. From Trevanion Road turn on Kings Drive. There is a paved walkway from there to the museum.



YOUR PET'S HEALTH

Hello, it's Shelby with Antrim Veterinary Hospital. You may be wondering why exams are needed yearly and why your veterinarian recommends bloodwork. Pets age much faster than we do. Although the old adage of 1 year = 7 years is not accurate for the entire life of your pet (see table), they are squeezing a lifetime into 12-15 years. Often pets are seen as puppies and kittens then not again for 4-5 years. If you own a 70lb lab that is like waiting 30-37 years between visits; a cat would be equivalent to 25-33 years. Can you imagine if you didn't go to the doctor for 7 years? A lot can happen to your pets during that time that you may not notice.

It is recommended that your pet visit a veterinarian every 6-12 months for an exam. Doing a thorough exam can tell you much more about your pet than you may realize. Veterinarians are trained to pick up on subtle cues such as changes in weight, behavior, activity, and also differences in gait patterns that may indicate hidden pain. During the exam your veterinarian will assess the pet from nose to tail including the teeth, mouth, nose, throat, heart, lungs, joints, bones, lymph nodes, eyes, ears, gastrointestinal system, skin and much more. They palpate the abdomen to check for any masses and changes in organ size. They palpate the skin to feel for any masses as well as assess lymph node size to help rule out cancers or infection.

Bloodwork is recommended at least yearly for pets as they age. Depending on the pet's age, breed, and physical exam findings the bloodwork may include a chemistry panel, complete blood count (CBC), electrolytes, urinalysis, and thyroid level. A chemistry panel includes tests to assess the

kidneys, liver, and pancreas, and includes a blood glucose or "sugar" level. A CBC is used to assess the different blood cells and the ratios of each and helps evaluate for anemia, dehydration, blood parasites, and some types of cancer. Electrolytes will show if the pet has an imbalance and can also help monitor certain diseases, especially kidney disease. A urinalysis assesses the kidneys and checks for urinary tract infections. The thyroid level indicates if a pet has thyroid disease. Low thyroid is common in certain dog breeds and high thyroid is common in cats 7 years and older. These tests can be performed here at our hospital allowing for a quicker diagnosis and therefore quicker treatment.

More routine tests include a 4dx test, feline leukemia (FeLV)/ feline immunodeficiency virus (FIV) test and a fecal exam. The 4dx test will check dogs for heartworm infection which is caused by mosquitoes and Ehrlichia, Anaplasmosis, and Lyme disease which are tick borne diseases common in our area. The FeLV/FIV for cats test for these common diseases—early detection helps us to manage them better as well as provide guidelines for other cats in the family. A fecal exam checks for intestinal parasites your pet may have obtained through the environment.

The earlier we can detect an issue the sooner we are able to treat and hopefully cure an illness/disease. Bloodwork can frequently detect an illness before the pet shows outward signs. 10% of pets have some underlying disease but appear healthy to their owners. Animals with kidney disease have lost about 65%

of their function before we can find it on blood or urine tests and 85% before they show clinical signs.

In addition to blood tests our hospital has a fully equipped surgery suite and each pet has a dedicated surgery technician. The patient is monitored continuously for blood pressure, carbon dioxide output, blood oxygen level, heart rate, respiratory rate, temperature, and ECG. All pets are on IV fluids, heating blankets, and have a customized pain management plan started prior to any procedure.

Our hospital also has a digital radiograph machine which may be very beneficial in diagnosing a pet. Digital radiographs are quick and allow the doctor to interpret images immediately. We are then able to bring the radiograph images into the exam room to review and discuss with the owner. We also have a digital dental radiograph unit which is invaluable at detecting dental disease under the gum line.

Here at Antrim our devoted doctors and staff will answer all of your questions and address your concerns to the best of our ability. We attend numerous lectures and seminars to stay current on the latest information. Our doctors will explain the diagnosis entirely along with any options available.
