They may avail themselves of courses presented at various Maryland Municipal League functions or Maryland Association of Counties functions, and through various other venues (i.e.: Carroll Community College) Upon graduation, a certificate is awarded and the official is better able to serve the constituents he/she represents. I am proud to be listed among the graduates. Our Council has eagerly embraced the Academy over the years and graduates include Councilmen Angelo Zambetti, Rick Hess and Councilwoman Diane Foster. Councilman Carl Ebaugh is a currently enrolled.

The second special event was my triple bypass surgery on July 26th. I spent the month of August recovering and am back to my duties at Atlantic Bay Mortgage Group & City Hall full time. ## WATER AND SEWER RATES INCREASE

Effective with the quarterly billing period beginning July 1, 2013, water and sewer rates will increase. The new rate will be reflected on your October bill. The new water rate will be \$5.77 per 1,000 gallons and the sewer rate will be at \$11.34 per 1,000 gallons. The rate increase is based on the adopted resolution passed in 2011 to fund low interest rate loans secured to pay for needed public water and sewer improvement projects. Questions regarding the increase can be directed to the City Clerk's office at 410-751-1100.

## WATER/SEWER BILLS

Water/sewer bills will be issued October 1st with a due date of October 31st. Any bill not paid by the 31st will be assessed a 10% late penalty and will be due by November 15th by 4:30 PM. If water service is interrupted for non-payment, there will be an additional fee of \$50 to reconnect water service.

## THE R. GARY ROOP CVM VETERINARY SCHOLARSHIP OF THE RALPH AND GRACE ROOP FAMILY FUND

### PURPOSE:

The purpose of this Fund is to honor the Family of Ralph and Grace Roop of New Windsor, Maryland by providing scholarship(s) in the name of their son R. Gary Roop, DMV on two levels:

First, A Scholarship will be provided to a Francis Scott Key High School graduating senior, of an agrarian background who has shown academic achievement and who wishes to pursue college and professional training to become a veterinarian.

Second, A scholarship will be provided to any Carroll County High School graduate from any high school in Carroll County, Maryland already accepted and currently in first or later years in any professional American College of Veterinary Medicine. A specialty in food/live-stock practice is preferred.

### SELECTION CRITERIA:

FUNDS will be awarded to an applicant who meets the following criteria:

A. PRE VETERINARY CURRICULUM: A Scholarship will be provided to a Francis Scott Key High School graduating Senior who has shown academic achievement and participated in High School FFA, extracurricular activities and community service like 4H, and has been accepted at Carroll Community College, McDaniel College at Westminster, MD or the University of Maryland with an expressed interest to pursue a pre veterinary medical study curriculum prior to acceptance into any professional American College of Vet-

## PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

### LEAF PICK-UP

Curbside leaf pick-up will be provided once again this fall. This service will take place weekly on Tuesdays, from October 29 through December 10, 2013. Please pack the leaves in plastic bags only and place them at the curb by 7:30 a.m. Bags should not weigh more than 30 pounds each, providing the bags are strong enough to support that weight when lifting. Please limit bag size to 50 gallon. Leaves will be taken to local farms and used as compost, allowing the use of plastic bags. Bags must be tied, and contain LEAVES ONLY. No grass, tree branches, sod, or trash will be picked-up. DURING THE LEAF PICKUP SCHEDULE (Oct. 29 - Dec. 10) GRASS CLIPPINGS will be collected without scheduling for pick-up, but paper kraft bags are still required for grass clipping disposal.

### TRASH & RECYCLING:

• Week of Thanksgiving Day Holiday: No Change. Collection will take place on its regular scheduled pick-up day of Wednesday, November 27, 2013.

Please be reminded trash collection is for household garbage only. The City's hauling company will not collect yard waste material.

ited American College of Veterinary Medicine leading to a degree of Doctor of Veterinary Medicine who is a graduate of any Carroll County High School. Preference will be given to a student with an interest in a food animal/livestock medicine career. The continuing student should exhibit some extra curricular activities and leadership.

C. The administration of the FUND shall be as follows:

1. The recipient(s) shall be selected and approved by the Board of Directors of the Community Foundation of Carroll County. However, the Donor or his designee may participate in the selection process and may make the award presentation.

2. All income in the Fund shall be used for fund purposes.

3. The money shall be transmitted by the Community Foundation of Carroll County directly to the desired college or university and applied directly to the student's tuition and books. The monies shall not be remitted to the FUND winner.



One of Clyde's greatest characteristics was his loving demeanor. On more than one occasion interaction with him caused both adults and children to rethink their fear of dogs. In two instances, dogs eventually joined households partly as a result of Clyde's attentions to the humans. Our closest neighbor admits to a general fear and dislike of dogs but volunteered to look after our buddy when we were out for long periods of time. Their oldest son often accompanied his mom or dad when looking in on Clyde and many times was responsible for letting Clyde out. We will always be grateful for their loving care of him. At eleven, he's known Clyde since he was an infant. He is so upset that he has yet to talk to me about Clyde's passing. I was concerned until his Mom quietly informed me that he told her he wants to provide a flowering dogwood tree -- how appropriate -- and a memorial stone in Clyde's memory.

This is about Clyde -- not us, but we do miss him terribly. We continue to be concerned about how long we are away from home, worrying that we must get back to relieve our "little guy." But, then when we get home, he's not at the door to greet us. There are no daily evening walks. That seems so out-of-kilter that my neighbor has volunteered to accompany me around the "hood" because it's become habit. We no longer hear footsteps on the floor above or below us, no longer hear the flapping of oversized ears, no longer have the pleasure of a cold nose startling us out of our reverie, no longer have an arm or leg go numb because a 60 pound animal is sleeping comfortably in our lap on a recliner.

Clyde was a rescue. We were his third family in the first 6 months of his life. We were what he needed, and he was what we needed. He came to us with his name -- it fit! He came to us with issues that seemed based on abuse. We spent the next 13 years convincing him that he was loved. It only took 5 minutes to convince us he loved us! Carroll County Humane Society does a wonderful job for our community. We may end up with another animal -- it will be a rescue. In the meantime, all of Clyde's belongings will go to the Humane Society so that they can be used to help other animals. If you knew Clyde, if you ever watched him walk down your street, if you ever asked what kind of dog he was (not a beagle or a "wiener" dog!), if you ever scratched him behind the ears or smiled at his "headlight," please consider making a donation in his memory to the Carroll County Humane Society.

We loved sharing Clyde with our neighborhood. Yep, Clyde was a rescue, but it's a toss-up as to who rescued who.

## AT NEW CHURCH HOME, MEMBERS WELCOME MISSION OF MERCY, PATIENTS

"I'm helping Mission of Mercy because it's a mission of my heart. I don't believe that anyone should have to go without health care," said Mary Ann Turner, a member of Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church at 38 West Baltimore St. in Taneytown.

Mission of Mercy relocated to Trinity in July after outgrowing their past location at Taneytown Baptist Church. With the new, larger location, they've added dental services to their current offering of primary healthcare services and prescription medications. All of the healthcare services and medications are provided to patients for free.

A retired nurse, Ms. Turner is putting her passion for Mission of Mercy's work into action. She organized members of Trinity - as well as residents of Carroll Vista Community - to make sandwiches and provide fresh fruit, coffee and water to waiting patients throughout the clinic day each month when Mission of Mercy is in Taneytown.

She noted that the patients are very grateful for the refreshments. "Yesterday someone insisted on giving us \$2 for the food and drinks - we couldn't make him keep it. But after he left, we put it in the Mission of Mercy box," she added.

"Pastor Josh Semovoski and members of his congregation have gone out of their way to welcome Mission of Mercy and our patients to our new Taneytown medical home," David Liddle, Mission of Mercy's Chief Financial Officer, said about the move.

"We're utilizing their fellowship hall and three of their Sunday School rooms," explained Mr. Liddle. Mission

of Mercy's Mobile Health clinics are comprised of not only their distinctive RV with the logo painted on its side, offering medical services with a pharmacy, but also a host church, where registration, triage, dental, hospitality, and records administration services are set up.

### THE NEEDS IN THE TANEYTOWN AREA ARE GREAT

"There's a huge need in Taneytown for our services for the working poor and those who are uninsured or underinsured," said Dr. Michael Sullivan, Chief Medical Director.

Ms. Turner said that as a volunteer, she has seen at least one person she knows come to the clinic for care. "I had no idea that person would need of Mission of Mercy's services, but you never know," she added.

Mission of Mercy provided more than 750 patient visits in the last 12 months in Taneytown. Currently, more than 200 patients have received care at the Taneytown clinic, and more than 750 patient medical visits were provided in the past 12 months. Elizabeth Galaida, grant writer for Mission of Mercy, noted that the nonprofit would now also have the capacity to serve up to 300 dental and physical therapy patients in the next 12 months. (Mission of Mercy is looking for a physical therapist to donate one day a month so they can offer physical therapy services.)

The mission of the Maryland/Pennsylvania Program of Mission of Mercy is to restore dignity and provide "healing through Love," said Jennifer Charlton, Executive Director of Mission of Mercy.

"That's why we don't ask patients to prove their poverty, and there's no cumbersome paperwork to fill out. Instead, we serve them with skilled care from experienced medical professionals, along with care and compassion, through every step of the process," she continued.

Once patients are registered at Mission of Mercy, they can make appointments for the monthly mobile clinic. Walk in patients, however, are served on a "first come, first served basis."

"There were people in line when I arrived at 6:30 a.m. to set up. Yesterday the clinic saw around 55-60 people. The need is really there," said Ms. Turner.

Seventy percent of Mission of

Mercy's patients suffer at least one chronic illness; visiting Mission of Mercy's mobile clinic gives these patients access to much needed healthcare on a regular basis, which improves their overall health.

Additionally, nearly 10 percent of their patients are seniors on fixed incomes with Medicare who often find themselves unable to afford their medical insurance co-pays and deductibles, which leaves them without access to critical health care and medications. Mission of Mercy serves seniors so they do not have to cut corners - or medications - in order to survive.

"Taneytown is an important location because it allows us to provide services to the smaller, rural and under-served communities in the immediate vicinity that have no facilities at all. This includes towns like Union Bridge, New Windsor, Keymar, Middleburg, Frizzleburg and

Uniontown, as well as folks in neighboring Adams and Frederick Counties, including Thurmont, Sabillasville and Littlestown," explained Ms. Charlton.

"Ideally, we'd like to get additional financial support from the community so we could have two clinic days a month in Taneytown," she added.

school. These rankings were based on SAT scores.







## QUALITY CARE FOR SENIOR PETS

Has your furry friend reached the Golden Years? If you notice any signs of aging such as gait changes, vision or hearing issues, loss of appetite or irritability please notify your veterinarian because they may be able to help make your pet more comfortable with these natural aging changes.
