## PUBLIC WORKS

### LEAF PICK-UP

Curbside leaf pick-up will continue through Tuesday, December 11, 2012. This service takes place weekly on Tuesdays. Please pack the leaves in plastic bags only and place them at the curb by 7:30 a.m. Bags should not weigh more than 30 pounds each, providing the bags are strong enough to support that weight when lifting. Please limit bag size to 50 gallon. Leaves will be taken to local farms and used as compost, allowing the use of plastic bags. Bags must be tied, and contain leaves only. No grass, tree branches, sod, or trash will be picked up. DURING THE LEAF PICKUP SCHEDULE (Oct. 30 - Dec. 4) grass clippings will be collected without scheduling for pick-up, but paper kraft bags are still required for grass clipping disposal.

### HOLIDAY COLLECTION SCHEDULE - TRASH & RECYCLING

- Week of Thanksgiving Day Holiday: No Change. Collection will take place on its regular scheduled pick up day of Wednesday, November 21, 2012.
- Week of Christmas Day Holiday: Collection will take place on Thursday, December 27, 2012, instead of Wednesday, December 26, 2012.
- Week of New Year's Day Holiday: Collection will take place on Thursday, January 3, 2012, instead of Wednesday, January 2, 2012.

Please be reminded trash collection is for household garbage only. The City's hauling company will not collect yard waste material.

CHRISTMAS TREE PICK UP: The City

will provide Christmas tree pick up again this year. Hughes Trash & Recycling will be collecting trees on Thursday, January 10, 2012. Please place your undecorated tree at the curb by 6 a.m. Since the trees will be recycled, all decorations, plastic bags, and tree stands must be completely removed, or your tree will not be picked up. This is a one day event only.

### STREET SWEEPING SCHEDULE

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 19, 2012

From 5AM to 10AM (no parking allowed):

- East & West Baltimore Streets  
Commerce Street, Reaverton Avenue, Ridge Avenue, Maryland Avenue, Crimson Avenue, and Bowie Mill Avenue and Kwanzan Street will also be swept. Monday, December 17, 2012

From 5AM to 10AM (no parking allowed):

- East and West Baltimore Streets  
Cherry Oak, Clover Court, Berry Court, Daisy Drive, Chestnut Court, Red Tulip, Spring Drive, and Skyline Drive will also be swept.

### SNOW REMOVAL

During a snow event, the priority for streets will be those that carry the heaviest traffic. State Highway crews are responsible for York, Frederick, East and West Baltimore Streets. City crews will initially plow the main arteries followed by side streets, courts and alleys. Please be advised that if you shovel snow from your driveway or parking area and your street has not been plowed, snow will be pushed back to the curb when plowing occurs. Depending on snowfall, it may be necessary to plow streets more than

once. Do not push or blow snow back into the street. Please do not approach snow plow operators while they are removing snow from City streets. Contact the Public Works Director at the City Office with any concerns or complaints you may have. On days when there is trash pickup, citizens are encouraged to shovel out a place next to the street where the cans are placed or place the containers at the edge of the street. Please help us maintain accessibility for fire protection, by clearing snow from around fire hydrants that are in the vicinity of your residence. Persons parking in the metered areas are reminded that they must move their vehicles to the public parking lots, promptly following a heavy snowfall. This is to allow the City to haul the snow from the metered areas. Vehicles not moved promptly after no-parking signs have been placed on parking meters may be towed at owner's expense. Citizens are asked to assist City crews by parking vehicles in their driveways and not on the street; this facilitates much more efficient snow removal and provides you with a wider plowed street. Citizens in cul-de-sacs must park vehicles in their driveway to avoid having snow pushed and piled up around vehicle. Also, vehicles in cul-de-sacs should never park vertically to the curb.

Citizens are reminded that snow removal from sidewalks is the responsibility of the property owner. Snow must be removed from sidewalks within ten (10) hours of a snowfall. Fines will be assessed for non-compliance, in addition to the cost and expense to the City of the removal of snow. We seek your cooperation, and we will do our best to provide a quality service.

The Carroll Hospital Center Foundation, the non-profit organization that oversees the fundraising efforts of Carroll Hospital Center and Carroll

Hospice, announced today that the Taneytown-based Kahlert Foundation has donated \$5 million to the "Campaign to Cure & Comfort, Always," a new \$22 million community fundraising initiative. This is the first multi-million dollar gift the hospital has received in its 50-year history.

"We are honored that the Kahlert Foundation has chosen to give so generously to our campaign," said John Sernulka, Carroll Hospital Center's president and CEO. "This gift will impact thousands of people in our community and will continue to shape the future of quality health care in Carroll County."

Funds donated through the "Cam-

paign to Cure & Comfort, Always" will directly support five key areas that will further the hospital's vision including:

- 1) Cancer center - Beginning in 2013, a new cancer center will be constructed adjacent to the Dixon Building on Carroll Hospital Center's campus. The new facility will house expanded cancer services and provide unparalleled, coordinated care for patients with all types and stages of cancer.
- 2) Community education and wellness center - Major renovations to the Dixon Building will include new conference space for healthy living and learning opportunities as well as an expanded library

and resources to help the hospital better prevent illness and promote wellness in the community.

- 3) Cardiovascular and stroke - Cardiovascular diseases and stroke are two of the leading causes of death in Carroll County. To address this community need, Carroll Hospital Center plans to develop clinics for congestive heart failure, pulmonary hypertension, chronic pulmonary disease and diabetes. The hospital also hopes to expand its offering of vascular procedures, angioplasty program and begin to work towards earning designation as a stroke center.

4) Emerging technology - With support from campaign funds, Carroll Hospital Center plans to continue to obtain the most advanced diagnostic, medical and communications equipment and make improvements in electronic medical records, medication safety, comprehensive tele-education for patients and other clinical advancements.

5) Endowment funds - Campaign funds

will be used to create an interest accruing savings account that Carroll Hospital Center and Carroll Hospice can use to support everyday non-reimbursable expenses such as bereavement and spiritual services, the palliative pediatric care program, navigation services, gaps in medical costs vs. reimbursement, funding scholarships, community outreach and other needs.

The campaign's focuses on hospice and cancer care hold special meaning for Greg Kahlert, president of the Kahlert Foundation, and motivated the

foundation's significant donation. His father, William Kahlert, co-founder of Evapco, Inc., died from liver cancer in 2011.

"My father bravely fought cancer for 12 years, but eventually passed away from the disease," says Greg. "During the last days of his life, Dad received excellent care and comfort from hospice. Hospice provides an important service for families dealing with a loved one with a terminal illness."

"The new cancer center is a very worthy cause," he continues. "It will help

thousands of local residents and for us, helping others to fight - and survive - cancer will be very rewarding."

Lee Primm, chairman of the "Campaign to Cure & Comfort, Always", believes that with the community's help, each of the campaign's goals are well within reach.

"I have absolute faith in the community," he said. "Since the very first door-to-door campaign that built this hospital, this community has always stepped up when asked, and it will never







## HOLY NAME SOCIETY HONORS SCHOOL SISTERS OF NOTRE DAME

St. Joseph Taneytown has honored the School Sisters of Notre Dame who staffed its parish school. For 55 years, from the 1917 opening until the school closed in 1972, the sisters served the Taneytown parish. In a project named "Steps of the Sisters" and sponsored by the parish Holy Name Society, bricks noting the name and dates of service for each of the 56 sisters have been installed into a walk in the Trinity Garden, a prayer garden established in the parish courtyard in 2003.

Invitations were sent to the seven living sisters who taught at St. Joseph School, as well as a general invitation to other S.S.N.D. sisters to attend the dedication ceremonies. A morning mass followed by a ribbon cutting in the courtyard and a luncheon reception in the parish center honored these dedicated women. Eight sisters were able to attend including Sr. Rosemary Spodnik who taught there in 1953 and 1954 and Sr. Marianne Roderick, the last principal of the school. The church was filled with former students who joined the celebration.

Msgr. Martin E. Feild was the celebrant for the liturgy and former students Debbie Ovedrholtzer Frazier, Terry Eyler

Smith, and Michael Peters, served as Ministers of the Eucharist.

Steve Parsley, a 1972 student when the school closed, and Walter Shipley and his sister Patsy Shipley Weishaar, students from the 1950's, carried the offertory gifts. Romaine Feeser Koontz, a 1948 graduate, presented a rose to each of the eight attending sisters.


